Directions to Meeting: Take the Cretin-Vandalia exit from I94 and take Cretin Ave six blocks south to the St. Thomas campus. Murray-Herrick Campus Center (MHCC), the site of the meeting, is off of Cleveland Ave. South, which is two blocks east of Cretin. Enter parking lot G from Cleveland Ave South, between Ashland and Portland Ave. MHCC is the building at the end of the parking lot. Room 304 is in the old part of MHC, to the left (south end of the building). Take the sidewalk to the left from the parking lot and go in the back door of MHC (east side of bldg), go through two sets of double doors and turn right through more doors to the elevator. Take the elevator to Room 304. Be sure to take the elevator in the old part of the bldg; the elevator in the new part of the bldg does not go to Room 304.

Parking permits are not needed after 6 pm on Fridays in the red and yellow lots.

Maps are available at www.stthomas.edu/campusmaps/stpaul.asp. The color version is easier to read but takes longer to download than the black and white version. MHC is #5 on the map; the most convenient parking (and access to the dock) is lot G..

NOOZ from the PREZ

The renewed interest in training new hams has spread to unlikely places. The Minneapolis VA Hospital recently staged a two-day Technician License course, on the weekend of December 8th and 9th. The course was organized in response to requests from hospital administrators to train and license hospital staff to be able to use the ham radio equipment recently deployed to hospitals across the TC metro area.

Organizers were **David Adriansen, KDØCKC**, Emergency Coordinator at the Minneapolis VA Hospital and **Leo Bosard, W9IXI**, from Mankato, which sent a contingent of students to the course. Adriansen gained his ham license after taking this course that he organized.

The Bloomington club has had experience doing two-day Technician courses and was a model for the VA course. The format involves teaching the correct answers to the test questions, with an explanation as to why the answers are correct. 46 out of 49 students passed the Tech. test, which was given at the end of the course.

Various people taught the course, including SPRC Education Coordinator, **Allan Klein, WØNLY**, who did an excellent job (I happened to observe part of the section that he taught).

Radio clubs had the opportunity to put in a word for their clubs during the class. Allan called me and invited me to come say a few words about SPRC. I hurriedly wrote up a flyer extolling the virtues of the St. Paul Radio Club, ran to Kinko's to get 50 copies made, and took them to the class at the time that Allan specified. The flyer appears elsewhere in this *Ground Wave*. I briefly talked to the class about clubs in general and SPRC in particular. Every student received a SPRC flyer. SPRC was the only radio club to give a presentation about its club..

It was inspiring to see almost 50 people giving up an entire weekend in December, on two of the coldest days of the year, to learn about ham radio. In our

October 2007 SPRC meeting, MN Section Manager **Skip Jackson, KSØJ**, told us that area hospitals are looking for ham volunteers to show new hams on their staffs how to use the equipment. Tell Skip if you wish to do this at a hospital and he will relay the message to the hospital that expressed interest. I have volunteered to help at Fairview Southdale Hospital, which is 3½ miles from where I live.

SPRC email addresses of officers/volunteers are in flux. The addresses aren't working at the moment because I deleted them, for the reason explained below.

I had rearranged the way the email addresses were presented on the SPRC website, so that it would not be possible for them to be harvested by spammers. I did this too late. I suddenly started receiving a lot of spam, which I traced to my SPRC addresses for prez and webmaster. For about half the spam, it was mentioned in the subject line things such as health insurance, foreclosure listings, makeup kits, watches for sale, buying your house. The other half had subject lines which did not refer to the content of the messages. I don't open spam so I don't know what they involved. To find what addresses were used in sending the spam to me, I right-clicked, then clicked on Properties, then on Details. The address that the message is sent to is given there.

I could add a second domain to the website, free for a year, so I have done that. Next I need to get that domain into the email setup program and redo all the email addresses. I will present them in a way which will not be harvestable by spammers (I hope).

I'm looking forward to our **Annual Auction** January 4th (yes, it will be 2008 already). Either grab the old equipment and attractive junk that you no longer have a need for and bring it to the Auction to sell (to get \$\$\$\$), or come to the Auction to see what you might want to buy. The FM Club is having their ham jam and flea market on January 8th. Come buy stuff at the SPRC Auction and sell it at the FM flea market!

St. Paul Radio Club Auction Rules

As with any event involving the exchange of funds, there are certain rules to follow. Please read and familiarize yourself with these rules.

1. Registration of equipment and issuance of bidder numbers starts at 6:30 p.m. The auction will begin after a brief business meeting and continue until each lot is sold or until terminated by combined rulings of the SPRC President and Auction Committee (SPRC Board). Personal sales will not be permitted on the premises.

2. Equipment will be sold to the highest bidder. Lots not receiving the minimum bid will be returned to the seller without charge.

3. The St. Paul Radio Club and The University of St. Thomas will not be responsible for items lost, stolen, or damaged.

4. The St. Paul Radio Club reserves the right to limit quantities.

5. All buyer and seller transactions with the St. Paul Radio Club Treasurer must be completed on the day of the auction. No equipment will be allowed off the auction premises without proof of ownership.

6. Equipment registration will be limited to 20 lots per person and each lot will be sold for one price. Lots of similar equipment by the same seller may be combined by auction officials.

7. Equipment remaining on the auction premises 30 minutes after the auction closes will become property of the St. Paul Radio Club and will be disposed of accordingly unless prior arrangements are made with and are agreed upon by the Auction Committee.

8. Buyers must register and have a bidder's number. Bids cannot be ac-

cepted from persons not displaying a bidder's card.

9. Buyers will not be permitted to take possession of equipment without showing a properly marked receipt.

10. Buyers may be required to show proof of a current, valid Amateur Radio License for the purchase of transmitters and amplifiers.

11. Personal checks will be accepted with proper identification.

12. A 10% commission, to a maximum of \$10 per lot, will be charged to the seller. These funds will be donated to the ARRL Spectrum Defense Fund.

13. Sellers will be paid by check for sold equipment after the SPRC Treasurer receives payment from the buyer. To reduce payment waiting time, BUYERS are requested to pay for each item when purchased.

14. The St. Paul Radio Club does NOT warrant the condition of any item placed at auction.

Circuit Builders

The Circuit Builders will meet Saturday, January 19th after the club breakfast (which is at Perkins in the Midway). We meet in OSS 415 on the University of St. Thomas campus at 11am. OSS is located on the SW corner of Cretin and Summit. Parking is in the lot one block west of Cretin at Grand.

Note to New Hams

New hams, in fact any ham who wants to gain experience, plz tune in to the St. Paul Radio Club **Two-meter Net on Wednesday nights at 7 p.m., 145.310 MHz**, no PL tone. Listen to the "old" hams on the Net to get an idea of how to speak on the Net (it's pretty easy), then check in yourself. Usually the Net Control Operator (NCO) asks for check-ins and hams give their call sign, while the NCO makes a list of these callsigns. The NCO then calls on each callsign one by one, and each person speaks when called on, giving their name, callsign, and whatever they want to say to the Net.

If you don't have a 2m radio yet, but have a scanner, you can listen to the Net on the scanner. Some old AM/FM/PSB radios also can be tuned to our 145.310 MHz frequency on the Public Service Band.

We will look forward to hearing from on the the Net! Eventually you may wish to take a turn as NCO (also pretty easy). Coordinator of the Net is **Andy Lokken, KCØTUD**.

Refreshment Coordinator Duties

Provide snacks of some sort and hot and cold beverages for meetings and some events for the SPRC. Requires at least one person to be present at all functions so at least one back up partner is needed.

At St. Thomas, the food service provides the coffee set up, which comes with cups/napkins/cream and sugars. Simply contact Tom Sturm and have him order it for the meeting night. You pick it up on the 2nd floor off the back elevator on a cart and bring it to the room we are using that night, and return the cart to that point after the meeting.

Cold beverages should be at least four selections of pop or juice and should include two diet items. About 6 to 8 quarts. Snacks should be finger held cookies or donuts, 5 to 7 dozen, depending on expected attendance. You also need some plastic silverware, plates and napkins, table covers. Currently, all of this is contained in two plastic tubs with covers and easily transported.

Clean up consists of disposing of waste, and keeping or giving away leftovers depending on parishability.

Bookkeeping consists of receiving a monetary account, and a contribution can. Much like your own checking account, you keep a debit and credit account of cash received and paid out receipts. If the account remains self-sustaining, that's great. If not, a yearly contribution of \$50 is issued from the club and more is available if needed.

Members are still bringing snacks to meetings as additional items, thank them and serve it as needed.
